

Modification of Registered Child Support Orders (UIFSA)

Is the registered order the one "controlling" child support order entitled to recognition under UIFSA?

NO ⇨

The order may not be modified with respect to vested, nonmodifiable arrearages that accrued before the date another order was determined to be the one "controlling" order.

YES



Does the obligor, the individual obligee, or the child still live in the **ISSUING STATE**?

NO ⇨

The order may be **REGISTERED FOR MODIFICATION** in the **responding state** *if* (a) the moving party is a **non-resident** of responding state and responding state has personal jurisdiction over other party, *or* (b) all individual parties file **written consent**, *or* (c) all individual parties **reside in responding state**. G.S. 52C-6-611(a), 613.*

YES



Have all of the individual parties filed **WRITTEN CONSENT** with issuing tribunal authorizing responding tribunal's assumption of CEJ?

YES ⇨

Order may be **REGISTERED FOR MODIFICATION** in **responding state**. G.S. 52C-6-611(a)(2).*

NO



The **responding** tribunal **MAY NOT MODIFY** the order. G.S. 52C-6-611(a).

*Note: The responding state's law applies with respect to the grounds for modification and the amount, scope, and duration of the modified order, except that the responding state may not modify any aspect of the registered order that could not be modified under the law of the original issuing state.
